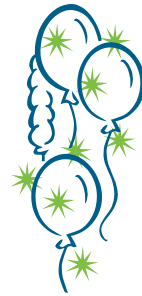

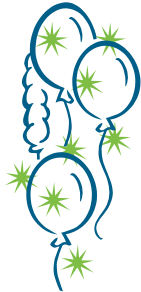

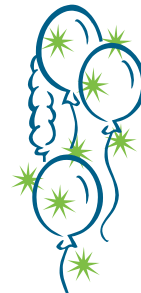

Special guests and award recipients:

Kathy Miller, the president of the Texas Freedom Network, a nonpartisan, grassroots organization that advances religious freedom and individual liberties in Texas. The organization was instrumental in defeating initiatives for textbook censorship and faith-based deregulation.

Idit Klein is the executive director of Keshet, an organization that aims to ensure the full inclusion of gay, lesbian, bisexual, and transgender Jews in all parts of the Jewish community. Keshet offers support, training, and resources to create a Jewish community that welcomes and affirms LGBT Jews.

Ruth Messinger is president of American Jewish World Service (AJWS), a faith-based international human rights

organization that works to alleviate poverty, hunger, and disease in the developing world. Ms. Messinger assumed this role following a 20-year career in public service in New York City, including being the first woman to secure the Democratic Party's nomination for mayor in 1997.

Terry O'Neill, president of the National Organization for Women (NOW), is a feminist attorney, professor and activist for social justice. O'Neill oversees NOW's multi-issue agenda, which includes advancing reproductive freedom, promoting diversity and ending racism, stopping violence against women, winning lesbian rights, ensuring economic justice, ending sex discrimination, and achieving constitutional equality for women.

Alexandra Pelosi, an award-winning documentary filmmaker and writer, will be receiving the Woman Who Dared Award. Ms. Pelosi's ground-breaking journalism and filmmaking has illuminated the democratic process and inspired a new generation of activists.

Hannah Rosenthal, the Obama administration's Special Envoy to Monitor and Combat Anti-Semitism, will be receiving the Faith and Humanity Award. Ms. Rosenthal has worked fiercely as an outspoken advocate against anti-Semitism and a tireless defender of human rights.

Representative Debbie Wasserman Schultz (D-FL), an NCJW member, will be speaking at the Installation Banquet Saturday evening.
