45th NCJW National Convention held in Dallas, March 3-5, 2011

Over 300 women from fifty-one NCJW sections around the country attended the 45th National Convention of the National Council of Jewish Women. The convention was held at the Fairmont Hotel. The NCJW Greater Dallas Section was well represented with over forty women in attendance over the 3-day convention.

Three members of the Greater Dallas Section were installed on the new National board. They are **Joni Cohan** (Vice President), **Julie Lowenberg**, and **Sue Tilis**.

Former Speaker of the House and current House Minority Leader, Nancy Pelosi, and her daughter, documentary filmmaker, Alexandra Pelosi, both received the NCJW "Woman Who Dared Award."

On Thursday, the convention was officially opened with a Texas Kick-Off – a musical skit, written and directed by **Sharon Ross**, and coordinated by **Jody Platt**. There was joyous singing and dancing Friday night at the musical tribute to Jewish composer and songwriter, Debbie Friedman (z"l) led by **Judi Ratner**, accompanied by Max Einsohn. Dallas Section Board member, **Rabbi Nancy Kasten** led a beautiful, Shabbat morning service filled with singing and dancing. **Rhona Frankfurt** coordinated local arrangements, such as arranging centerpieces with items that were later donated to Jewish Family Service, the Legacy at Preston Hollow, and others. Many volunteers were enlisted by the Greater Dallas Section to support the convention activities.

The Dallas Section project for the teaching and promotion of healthy eating, fitness, and fighting obesity program called **Food+Fit=Fun**

won the **Vision for America Showcase Award**.

Among the prominent speakers at the convention were Hannah Rosenthal, Special Envoy to Monitor and Combat Anti-Semitism at the US Department of State. She described using techniques of education and empathy such as a tour of Auschwitz, to successfully persuade a group of Moslem leaders to disavow the Holocaust deniers. She was awarded the "Faith and Humanity" award.

Terry O'Neill, President of the National Organization for Women presented the Hannah Stein Memorial Lecture. Kathy Miller, President of Texas Freedom Network, addressed the group about the particular challenges we face here in Texas in our state legislature.

Other speakers included Ruth Messinger, President of the American Jewish World Service, **Nancy K. Kaufman**, the new CEO of NCJW and former executive director of the Boston JCRC, the outgoing National President, **Nancy Ratzan** and the incoming National President, **Linda Slucker** and **Shari Eshet**, Director of the NCJW Israel Office.

It was a highly successful convention, in every way, and NCJW members left Dallas inspired to carry on their important community service projects, advocacy, education, and work in support of women, children and families in local communities and in Israel. Ideas were exchanged, new friends were made, national leadership was elected and installed, resolutions were passed and bylaws were revised. It was announced that the next national convention will take place in St. Louis in 2014.

RECIPE for ART: HIPPY at the DMA

For over 20 years, NCJW has sponsored educational and culturally appropriate programs at the **Dallas Museum of Art** for five-year old children and their parents enrolled in the Home Instruction Program for Parents of Preschool Youngsters (HIPPY). More than 90% of these families are low-income, many have limited English proficiency and very few have ever visited a museum.

The program's goals are to introduce the children and their parents to the broad concepts of what a "museum" is and to what "art" should mean to them; to help them make connections between art work and their own experiences; to introduce the basic elements of art, and to create a welcoming atmosphere so that the families will feel comfortable in a museum setting.

The volunteer's role is to warmly greet the families, make them feel at home, assist with either the children's or parents' tours throughout the museum (you can become a tour leader!), and help with their personal art projects that each child and parent takes home.

NCJW is especially fortunate to have the Museum's early childhood specialist work with us. Until Leah Hanson came to the DMA three years ago, our talented volunteers designed the program. Leah has not only become our professional leader and instructor, but she has brought new depth and meaning to the program while encouraging the volunteers to continue being an integral part of working with the families.

The **DMA HIPPY VOLUNTEERS** are a cheerful enthusiastic group who enjoy the beautiful children, their parents, the works of art and their very special experiences working with these young families. One of our most active volunteers is **Barbara Franklin** who lights up the room as she greets the families with her wonderful smile and unbelievable enthusiasm. Barbara says, "I strongly urge anyone who is interested to join our happy band of volunteers. Like me, you will want to go home and create your own art and to share your love of art with the children in your life!"

"Hello Israel"

"Hello Israel" is becoming more relevant than ever. Right now area sixth-graders are studying the Middle East and Israel. Our volunteer presenters visited three classrooms in February at Ben Franklin Middle School, and the social studies teachers were all abuzz with lesson plans and activities about the Middle East. With all of the turmoil going on in that area, our presenters were given an excellent opportunity to offer up a favorable impression of the democratic nation of Israel.

"Hello Israel" has been teaching fun facts about Israel to area students for over 25 years. The program is a national NCJW project, but the latest efforts of the Dallas branch are individually customized with the help of our crack team of volunteer presenters. While the presenters follow a script, they are encouraged to speak with spontaneity, and impart information about the latest developments and innovations. Politics and religion are not the focus here, but the team does stress the dual facts of Israel's democratic government and Israel's policy of freedom of religion for all.

The ninety-minute presentation also offers a refreshment (juice and pita...typical Israeli fare), and the presenters end the program by teaching the students to dance the Hora, to the tune of Hava Nagila.
