Winter Meeting

Winter Meeting – For the Love of Food NCJW Dallas Raises Awareness on Our City’s “Food Deserts”

Our love for fresh food and serving the community radiated during the **NCJW Dallas’ Winter Meeting**. Over a delicious lunch hosted by Café Momentum, the speakers expressed their concern for the lack of access to fresh food plaguing South Dallas.

The discussion revolved around the meaning of “*food deserts*.” Explained by **Daron Babcock, the CEO and founder of Bonton Farms**, the term describes areas where access to fresh foods is very scarce or non-existent.

In South Dallas, where Mr. Babcock started his farming experiment to fuel the community with fresh food, employment opportunities and meaningful social interaction, diabetes, heart disease, and obesity rates are skyrocketing. Unemployment follows similar trends, along with criminal activity. Everything is interconnected, because, Mr. Babcock explained, “food is just a piece of the puzzle.”

In tandem, **Anga Sanders, the CEO and founder of Feed Oak Cliff**, pressed on the same concerns. She painted a complex and alarming reality, particularly how food insecurity corrodes many aspects of life. Very emotionally, she dispelled that lack of motivation argument by noting that “even poor mothers want fresh food for their babies.”

Chad Houser, the founder of Café Momentum, that trains troubled youth in the art of fine cuisine and life, presented more data. Especially linking “food deserts” to health issues and unemployment, Mr. Houser urged for more public awareness on poverty. “People are a product of their circumstances,” he noted, and without looking at poverty through lenses fitted to reality, most efforts - both public and private, won’t have the desired impact.

Filled with valuable lessons and heroic examples of community service, the NCJW Dallas Winter Meeting was food for the soul, a call for action, and a Valentine’s Day well-spent.

The 106th Birthday Luncheon – An Overwhelming Success

January 22, 2019 was a gloomy and raining day. That all changed when you entered the grand ballroom of the Westin Galleria Hotel. Your eyes were treated to a beautifully adorned room and upbeat music.

The tone for the luncheon was set when President Renee Karp welcomed the sold out crowd. Rabbi Elana Zelony began her invocation with the question “ Have you ever had the coffee moment”? She emphasized that for over 106 years the women of NCJW starting with Hannah G Solomon, have overcome the “coffee moment” to change the lives of women, families, and children for the better.

The program continued after a delicious lunch with Mayor Mike Rawlings presenting the Pioneering Partner award to City of Dallas Welcoming Communities and Immigrant Affairs (WCIA). In his introduction of Liz Cedillo-Pereria, the director of WCIA, he stated how proud and grateful he is of NCJW and its impact on the greater Dallas Community. In fact, NCJW planted the seed for WCIA. Ms. Cedillo-Pereria’s acceptance speech continued the theme of what women can do with hard work and determination regardless of background.

The icing on the cake was the keynote speaker Ellen Goodman. Ms. Goodman spoke about the times we are in now, and how compassion and empathy will result in both men and women being treated equally in the work place and beyond. Thus creating an environment where civility abides and we can do justice and repair the world.

This luncheon, besides being a community event, is our major fundraiser, and funds we did raise. The sponsorship levels went from \$1,850.00 to \$50,000.00. The Kalman and Ida Wolens Foundation was the \$50,000.00 sponsor with a challenge grant. Texas Capital Bank was the presenting sponsor at the \$25,000.00 level. Two other sponsors at that level were Nancy A Nasher and David J. Haemisegger, and SHARE Endowment Fund sponsoring the speaker. In addition to the sponsorship levels there was almost \$50,000 in donations below the \$1,850.00 level.

The 106th Birthday Luncheon raised a little over \$500,000.00. This could not have happened without all the hard work of the board, the host committee, the honorary chairs and the co-chairs. We should all feel very proud of a job well done.
